Common Assessment Activities

To achieve the Numeracy and Literacy requirements of NCEA students now need to sit three test like activities - one each for Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Students can sit these activities multiple times . Passing these three activities is a requirement to achieve any level of NCEA. Each of these assessment activities is expected to take one hour, but students can spend longer if they wish to. We have entered all of our Year 10 students to take part in these activities at the end of term 3 . Any Year 11s that have not yet achieved their Numeracy and Literacy requirements have also been entered.
